Good evening everyone!

- 1. On behalf of the Singapore Chinese Chamber of Commerce & Industry (SCCCI), I sincerely thank Minister Grace Fu for your presence today. I also thank all the guests from Singapore and abroad for actively participating in this year's International Women's Day Conference!
- 2. The SCCCI Career Women's Group (CWG) has been organising this conference since 2004, inviting outstanding career women to gather together to celebrate, connect, share their life and career journeys, encourage and inspire one another.

- 3. Besides shining in their careers and working hard for their families, women today also serve and give generously to the needy in society. With this spirit of resilience and sense of responsibility, coupled with the qualities of being a good listener, being understanding and accepting, women have become the backbone of the family, workplace and society. Not only are they admirable, they will also have greater influence.

- 7. As we celebrate International Women's Day today, we must also thank our Government for promoting gender equality over the years, benefitting women across the different sectors. For example, in the early childhood sector where most teachers are women, the Government announced last year that early childhood educators will be getting a pay raise, to affirm their efforts in nurturing the next generation. As we fought the pandemic over the past three years, many of our frontline healthcare workers are also women who protected our lives in the crisis, and we express our utmost respect to them.

In the Budget 2023 that was announced recently, the extension of Government-paid paternity leave and additional assistance to lowerincome families to facilitate their children's pre-school enrolment are great news for women and families which we need to be grateful for. SCCCI will definitely work more closely with the Government and businesses to promote gender equality, to make our economy and society better and more vibrant!
- 9. It has been 29 years since the establishment of SCCCI's CWG. I am very happy to see CWG's dedication, growth and vitality over the years, making contributions to the country and society. I encourage everyone to continue inspiring one another and scale greater heights!
